Marina Bluvshtein

Adler's View on Tyranny and War and Implications for Contemporary Practice

The lecture explores the historical, theoretical, and personal-biographical roots of Adler's view on tyranny and wars. Major IP texts are revisited, with implications for contemporary psychological practice, parenting models, and social processes. The role of exogenous factors and lifestyle predispositions is considered in the development and maintenance of tyrannical personality.

Bärbel Husmann

Adler's Religion. About Judaism in Adler's life and its significance for individual psychology

Adler was born a Jew but did not appear to be religious. The fact that he converted to Protestantism and was baptized may have been due to his desire become an equal member of society. The lecture explores the question of what it means against this background that "social interest" has become a central concept in individual psychology.

Edit Szélesné Ferencz

The meaning of trauma. The characteristics of individual psychological child and adolescent psychotherapy

In individual and group therapy for children and adolescents, the child's conscious and unconscious goals and the means to achieve them are understood. Traumatic experiences in childhood or adolescence require specific intervention. In this presentation, four cases will illustrate the processing of traumatic experiences in child/adolescent therapy.

Giovanni De Santis

Friends, enemies and others (or strangers?)

Being alien in oneself is becoming less and less tolerated by society, and phenomena such as ambivalence and Doubts find less and less space, which can also be observed in the therapeutic process. The particular attention is paid to the fact that Adler's emphasis on the sense of community should concern not only the patient himself, but also the community altogether.

Kristin White

Minding the gap: On the importance of recognizing difference in the psychoanalytic treatment of people who have experienced migration.

Starting with a situation in treatment, in which the therapist and patient both wanted to uphold a warm, friendly relation-ship with a person whose skin colour was different, this paper aims to show how important it is to "mind the gap". The attempts to close the gap and uphold an idealised view of "us all being the same", often cover up aggressive, envious and racist attitudes in the transference and in the counter-transference.
