Following the Welcome by the IAIP Board, we will enjoy the keynote speech by Erik Mansager, "Successive Simultaneity" - Adler and Contemporary Psychotherapy."

The keynote will be followed by parallel sessions presented by the five active IAIP sections:

Section **Psychotherapy – Children and Adolescents** will present *New languages and new techniques in child and adolescent psychotherapy: Adlerian theory facing the challenges of our time.*

Section **Psychotherapy – Adults** will present *Divergent Lenses, Shared Depths: An Adlerian Exploration of Dreams and the Unconscious.*

Section **Counseling** will present two tracks: *Counseling: Definition, interpretation, and practice in different countries,* and *Overcoming inferiority feelings caused by disability through encouragement.*

Section **Pedagogics and Education** will present *Understanding and Meeting the Needs of Parents and Teachers in a Changing World.*

Section **Science - Theory and Research** will present a *Survey of Adlerian Clinical Trainings*.

The next event is the March 20-22, 2026, regional IAIP conference in Osaka, Japan, organized jointly by Japanese, Taiwanese, and Korean colleagues, with the support of the IAIP Board. The topic is "Time to Blossom – Roots and Growth of Individual Psychology in Asia". Although all the oral presentations have been confirmed, the committee is still accepting poster proposals (by January 15th, 2026).
